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## **DAILY CARE OF SURGICAL SITE**

| WITH SUTURES                                   |  |
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| The surgical site was closed with stitch (es). |  |
| 1)   | Do not wet the area for 24 hours.  |
| 2)   | After 24hrs remove the white tape and gauze. (Leave the steri strips on) It is ok if they come off, but do not take them off.  |
| 3)   | Cleanse over the steri strips (if the steri strips have come off cleanse over incision site) with hydrogen peroxide or sterile saline on a cotton swab twice a day. Apply Polysporin or Bacitracin to the site.      |
| 4)   | Cover area with Telfa (non stick) or a dry adhesive bandage. Change dressing if it becomes wet   |
| 5)   | Continue daily care until stitches are removed. You may be instructed to continue care after stitch removal as well.   |
| 6)   | Activity restrictions: No ocean swimming or contact sports   |
| 7)   | Call the doctor if the site has increased redness, swelling, pain, or pus.   |
| 8)   | The stitch (es) need to be removed in days.  |
| 9)   | The doctor does not expect the site to bleed but if it does, apply direct pressure to the area for 7 minutes without stopping. If pressure does not stop the bleeding, take your child to your local emergency room. |

## **WITHOUT SUTURES:**

Follow steps 1 through 3. Continue daily care for one week or until completely healed.
